

Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity

Month of July 2017

SAFARI: We have two resolutions tonight regarding a program being offered through the Catskill

Watershed Corporation and the NYC DEP. These resolutions for the New York City-Funded Flood Buyout Program was a program that was initially discussed after Hurricane Irene and will be available to residents whose homes are located within a Flood Hazard Area. The program is designed to help communities and residents explore options for their parcel under several categories regarding past and/or potential flood hazards. This gives the option to residents to sell their property who may not have been eligible under the FEMA Buyout guidelines but may have sustained surmountable damages during past flood events or that have been identified through a Local Flood Analysis as having the potential to receive severe damages during future flood events. This program require several steps including assessment of the parcel and structures. The Town retains approvals throughout the process including approvals for final buyout. The Town is required to appoint an Outreach Lead and Assessment Lead. The Outreach Lead is essentially the person responsible to guide and assist the landowner and the Town through the process, the Assessment Lead is responsible for assessing the parcel through hydrologic study findings and Benefit-Cost Analysis of the remediation activity. We will be appointing personnel from Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County and the Ulster County Soil and Water Conservation District for these positions. We already had a few residents inquire about this program and expect applications over the coming months.

SHANDAKEN SEWER: Over the past few years CWC and Lamont Engineering have been ting an assessment for the potential of a Community Septic or Septic Maintenance District for the Hamle

conducting an assessment for the potential of a Community Septic or Septic Maintenance District for the Hamlet of Shandaken. They provided their conclusions to the Town last month and would like to have an opportunity to present the options to the public at an upcoming meeting. Essentially, the proposal calls for a combination of shared septic systems in the more densely located properties and a Sewer Maintenance District. Under this program the DEP would provide the Town a one-time influx of funds (approximately 6.2 Million dollars) to assist landowners in the designated district to replace their septic if a Notice of Violation is issued from a failure of their existing system. Residents would apply through the Town Board, as opposed to the CWC, for the funds to repair or replace the system. It is not clear yet that a fee would have to be established at the onset of the program, if acceptable to the residents of the proposed District, but in the long term a fee may be established in order to help maintain the fund in perpetuity. We will be setting up a special meeting for Shandaken residents to witness a presentation from the CWC and Lamont engineers and ask any questions they or any Board members may have. The meeting is to be scheduled for Tuesday, July 25 at 6:30 pm.

MEDICAL BUILDING: Last year we went out to bid for some repairs to the Town-owned Medical Arts Building in Phoenicia. The roof repair was completed in a timely fashion, but the contractor hired to repair the basement entrance could not complete the job due to personal issues that arose. We had other bids that we had received and were looking to award the job to the next bidder on the list, but that contractor

is too busy to do the work necessary. Ultimately, I think it best if we re-advertise for bids regarding this project and award next month.

Town Board member Faye Storms and I have been in conversation with a group of individuals who are interested in renting the building to again provide a mix of healthcare options including Medical practice, Acupuncture, Holistic healthcare and possibly Mental Health options for the community. We are working on negotiations of a contract and hope to have someone utilizing the building before the start of winter.

SUMMER RECREATION: Summer Recreation Program kicks off tomorrow. The Recreation Program will again be utilizing the UCAT Transportation System to and from Belleayre Beach three days a week. There are two field trips planned; one to the Bronx Zoo in early August and the Camp favorite Zoom Flume Water Park in Mid-August. We have a quite a few returning counselors and some new ones, but all are excited to see the kids and get to swimming, working on arts and crafts and simply enjoying another summer at the lake. We hope they all have a great season.

HIGHWAY: We have a resolution tonight to purchase a replacement pick-up truck for the Highway Department. Highway Superintendent Eric Hofmeister will review any bids received to ensure that it meets the specifications desired and will make a recommendation for the purchase.

MISC.: The Town recently received word that the Town Planning and Zoning Boards prevailed in the latest lawsuit filed by the Catskill Heritage Alliance regarding the proposed Belleayre Resort Project. In his decision, Judge Mott ruled that the claims made by the Heritage Alliance carried "no merit" and that the Boards' approvals have been upheld.

There are several events going on throughout the Town, most notably the Phoenician International Festival of the Voice which will be running this year from Friday, August 4^{th} through Sunday, August 6^{th} in the Parish Field in Phoenicia. We wish them the best of luck again and look forward to enjoying the repertoire they have provided us this year.

Our next regular meeting is scheduled for Monday, August 7, 2017 at 7 pm.

SUPPORTING PARTICIPATION IN THE VOLUNTARY NEW YORK CITY-FUNDED FLOOD BUYOUT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, in August 2011, the Town of Shandaken located in Ulster County, experienced widespread catastrophic flooding from Hurricane Irene, adversely affecting public and private infrastructure, homes and businesses, warranting the declaration of a countywide "State of Emergency," and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken's Flood Mitigation Plan identifies supporting the purchase, relocation or retrofitting of structures located in hazard-prone areas to protect structures and public infrastructure from future damages and to ensure the Town of Shandaken's eligibility for State and Federal Hazard Mitigation monies;

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken agreed to support eligible landowners to participate in the Hurricane Irene Flood Buyout Program funded by the NYS Emergency Management Office and FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program administered by Ulster County Office of Emergency Management in conjunction with New York City DEP and Ulster County Department of Environment; and

WHEREAS, at the request of local watershed communities, funding for a voluntary New York City-Funded Flood Buyout Program (NYCFFBO Program) has been made available pursuant to the Mid-Term Revisions to the 2007 FAD (2014) requiring New York City Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to commit \$15 Million to the NYCFFBO Program to be implemented in accordance with the conditions of the 2010 Water Supply Permit, as amended. In accordance with the FAD, after extensive negotiations and outreach, Watershed

Stakeholders have agreed upon a process for property evaluation and selection, as documented in "NYC-Funded Flood Buyout Program Property Evaluation and Selection Process" dated June 1, 2016 (Process Document), which relies on a further amendment of the 2010 WSP to allow DEP to implement the NYCFFBO Program in communities that elect to participate in the Program ("Communities"); and

WHEREAS, the stakeholders have identified five distinct categories of properties, as set forth in the Process Document, that may be eligible for acquisition under the NYCFFBO Program; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken wishes to opt in to Category One (*Hydraulic Study (LFA) Properties*), Category Two (*CWC Flood Hazard Mitigation Implementation Program*), Category Three (*Individual Buyout Properties (IBP) – Community Stream Projects*), Category Four (*IBP – Erosion Hazard*) and Category Five (*IBP – Inundation Hazard*); and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken will have candidate properties evaluated for substantial and imminent risk to life and property, as identified in the Process Document; and

WHEREAS, the NYCFFBO Program will not acquire properties unless the proposed acquisition is agreed to by the Town of Shandaken based on the specific procedure(s) used to confirm such municipal concurrence as noted in the Process Document; and

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved the Town of Shandaken wishes to opt into the NYCFFBO Program to facilitate potentially eligible properties in this category as outlined in the Process Document.

APPOINTMENT OF OUTREACH AND ASSESSMENT LEADS FOR THE VOLUNTARY NYC FUNDED FLOOD BUYOUT PROGRAM FOR FLOOD MITIGATION

WHEREAS, the Revised 2007 Filtration Avoidance Determination of 2012 required New York City to fund a Flood Mitigation Program; and

WHEREAS, one component of that program includes a voluntary NYC-Funded Flood Buyout Program (NYCFFBO) for communities to consider; and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of the voluntary NYCFFBO for village and hamlet designated areas to consider in the New York City watershed have been completed. Unlike the existing Land Acquisition Program, these acquisitions are solely for the purpose of flood mitigation efforts with the agreement of the involved municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken Flood Mitigation Plan identifies supporting the purchase, relocation or retrofitting of structures located in hazard-prone areas to protect structures and public infrastructure from future damages and to ensure the Town of Shandaken eligibility for State and Federal Hazard Mitigation monies; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken agreed to support eligible landowners to participate in the Hurricane Irene Flood Buyout Program funded by the NYS Emergency Management Office and FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program and administered by Ulster County Office of Emergency Management in conjunction with the New York City DEP and Ulster County Department of Environment; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken, will not be charged with funding the expenses for the Outreach and Assessment Leads for the NYCFFBO; and

WHEREAS, participating municipalities in the NYCFFBO are to provide a resolution designating the Outreach and Assessment Lead(s) to facilitate and represent the community through the process; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Shandaken recognizes it may choose to conduct these tasks independently or where no local entity is willing or able to undertake these roles, DEP, the CWC or their respective consultants would be available to be the Outreach or Assessment Lead for a particular category of property; and

WHEREAS, the NYCFFBO Program will not acquire properties unless the proposed acquisition is agreed to by the Town of Shandaken based on the specific procedure(s) used to confirm such municipal concurrence as documented in the "NYC-Funded Flood Buyout Program Property Evaluation and Selection Process" dated June 1, 2016.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved: The Town of Shandaken designates Aaron Bennett, through a contractual Agreement with Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County (CCEUC) as the Outreach Lead for Categories One through Five; and designates Aaron Bennett, through the same contractual Agreement with CCEUC, as Assessment Lead for Category Five. The Town of Shandaken designates Ulster County Soil and Water Conservation District as the Assessment Lead for Category Four and will enter into an Agreement with Mr. Bennett to facilitate the NYCFFBO on behalf of landowners eligible and approved by the Town of Shandaken to go through the program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town of Shandaken Supervisor is hereby empowered to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with CCEUC and UCSWCD; and

BE IT YET FURTHER RESOLVED, the Town of Shandaken may change the Outreach and Assessment Leads at any time in the future, as well as there may be unique individual community circumstances and needs that may enable either the Outreach or Assessment Lead to be the only lead needed by the that community.
