Shandaken Historical Museum Monthly Report for July 2024

The Museum is currently planning to take part in the Phoenicia Farmer's Market on a Sunday in September using our museum table to maintain an active presence in the community. On July 13th, the Museum participated in holding a flea market in Big Indian attended by over two dozen participants.

On July 19th, a large antique photograph of World War I war hero, Private Basil Smith of Pine Hill, NY was donated to the Museum collection by Dylan Gahan and the Pine Hill Smith Family based on Dylan's father's last wish.

The museum is continuing with its reorganization and inventory projects along with adding new exhibits including an exhibit on the life of Dr. Hideyo Noguchi, the illustrious Japanese doctor, microbiologist, and world health pioneer of the early 20th century. His historically important Shandaken home is still intact and relatively untouched but is in the process of being sold. There were over 40 visitors in July visiting the Museum from the west coast, New York City, New Jersey, and Europe - many leaving donations and grateful messages as they signed the registry. This July can be summarized by the word insanity for the Ambulance Service. Not only did we overt tragedy by catching a faulty inverter on an ambulance that could have been catastrophic, but are also dealing with a biennial Agency recert with the New York State Department of Health, Semi-Annual medication reporting with the Department of Health, training of new employees, and hurdles caused by a National AND State mandated electronic reporting standard that outpaced our current computing software required for completion of patient care records. That coupled with high summer call volume makes for some very exhausted Ambulance employees, and equally exhausted Ambulance administration!

That said, and thankfully without any hiccups, our Agency perseveres not just without the incredible help from our devoted employees, but yet again with the help of New Paltz Rescue Squad. New Paltz Rescue was able to assist Shandaken Ambulance in loaning much needed computer equipment in a stopgap measure to assure that we were able to accomplish our jobs with no adverse effect to the Town regarding reporting, compliance, or billing for each call for service. This is not the first time New Paltz Rescue has assisted Shandaken Ambulance (ala Hurricane Irene, Standard Operating Procedures, Etc.) and will likely not be the last.

Continued support from surrounding Squads wouldn't be possible without the camraderie, and mutual respect for what we do in the field for those that depend on us- and we are fortunate to have that support from those local Squads that truly believe that ideal. Mutual aid goes further than just the call for service, and we are fortunate to be surrounded by Ambulance Agencies that exemplify that in this County and beyond. To Chief Matthew Goodnow, the New Paltz Rescue Squad, and all of the other Departments and individuals that have helped us provide the best care possible to our citizens and visitors in their times of need, we are eternally greatful. We will always have your backs if we are able to do the same!

Request to Ulster County to Reduce Road Speed Limit

WHEREAS, it is the duty and obligation of the Shandaken Town Board to safeguard and ensure the safety and well-being of its residents, and

WHEREAS, In New York State, the statutory speed limit on all roads is 55 miles per hour and the New York State Department of Transportation has the authority to establish speed limits on state highways, county roads, and town roads, and

WHEREAS, Plank Road (County Route 40), between County Route 212 and Main Street, Phoenicia in the Town of Shandaken is frequented by pedestrians, hikers, bicyclists, and anglers, and

WHEREAS, high speed vehicular traffic presents a potential hazard to residents who wish to walk, bike, jog, or recreate in their own town, and

WHEREAS, a speed limit of 45 miles per hour or less is already posted for all other sections of County Route 40,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, pursuant to Section 1622.1 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of New York State, the Town Board petitions the Ulster County Department of Public Works and Ulster County Planning Department for the establishment of a speed limit of 45 miles per hour on all sections of Plank Road currently without a posted speed limit.
