The weather is changing for the better, and it seems that everyone is coming out of hibernation and finally stretching their legs. The same can be said of our furry friends that owned this place long before we ever did- particularly the Black Bear. As many locals know, April ushers in the time to secure garbage, limit outdoor cooking, bring the bird feeders in, secure livestock and family pets, and heighten awareness altogether as hungry bears emerge. As there are many that are new to Town, or have recently made their summer home full time residences, PLEASE do your part in assuring that you are not potentiating our already heightened bear issue. By no means should anyone EVER feed, or attempt to approach bears (*that includes bear selfies which regretiably, believe it or not, are a thing*). Remember many bears that forage in our hamlets lose their natural fear of humans, and can become very demanding and aggressive when it comes to a meal. Also, a momma bear will protect their yearling cubs with unmatched ferocity- so as cute as they look, steer clear. Bear attacks are rare in our Town, but have happened in the past. If by chance you have a close encounter with a bear, make yourself look as big as possible, make plenty of noise, and steadily move away without running. Just remember, if you respect the environment we are afforded to enjoy, it will respect you back.

You will see that tonight the Town Board will be advertising for bids for a replacement ambulance. The Ambulance that we are replacing is showing its age, particularly with body corrosion and high mileage. Overall the ambulance served us extremely well, and brought our ability to reach patients during adverse weather conditions, or off the beaten path to new heights due to its 4 wheel drive capabilities. Since its purchase more than ten years ago, 5 surrounding Squads added 4 wheel drive capable ambulances to their fleets. As the old adage says- "if it ain't broke, don't fix it"- so we will be specifying a nearly identical replacement as training will be minimal.

COVID UPDATE- As of 5/2, there were 439 active cases of COVID in Ulster County- 1,426 less than one month ago. There are only 2 active cases in the Town of Shandaken at this time. Total cumulative cases in the Town have reached 110, with 108 of those individuals thankfully recovered. To date we have had no fatalities, and we are one of only five Towns in Ulster County that can say that. Total cumulative cases in the County have reached 14,791, with 255 fatalities. 14,097 cases have successfully recovered.

Please continue to WEAR A MASK when in public, practice social distancing, and limit gatherings. It could save your life!
