
US Postal Service – Curtis Bullard spoke – Assured us that Chichester Post Office will remain open since the new owner does want to renew the lease.

Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity

MONTH OF AUGUST 2017

LAWSUIT: Last month the Town received papers regarding a claim against our assessment of the value of the Emerson Complex from Kaatskill Development Holdings, LLC and Fort Shandaken Associates. They have in the past been involved in a PILOT (Payment in Lieu Of Taxes) Program through the County. Last year was their last under the program and this year would have been their first operating under full assessment. They feel that they are being overassessed. This is not unfamiliar territory for us as we have faced these challenges before and have either settled with the Plaintiff on a valuation or received a judgement in our favor. Due to the nature of the assessment challenge regarding a large commercial structure the Town, as it has in the past, is hiring an attorney, Van DeWater & Van DeWater, LLP, specializing in these cases to assist us in negotiating with the Plaintiff or helping us defend ourselves in the case the complaint goes to court. Either way, the Chair of the Assessment Board, Peter DiModica, feels confident in his department's assessment and is readily prepared to enter into discussions with the complainants to defend their decisions. We have a resolution tonight to enter into an agreement with the law firm.

OTHER RESOLUTIONS: We have a resolution to promote one of our Ambulance Drivers to EMT following passing their certification exams through NYS. Terese Surak has been a driver for our Ambulance Department for some time and, according to Chief Whalen, will be an asset to us in the EMT ranks. She will be Full-time receiving a wage of \$10.70 per hour which is just \$1 over the NYS Minimum Wage.

We are also hoping to have some bids for the Basement Door Replacement for the building on Ava Maria Drive. If no bids are received then I will directly contact a number of contractors to get this job accomplished.

SHANDAKEN SEWER: We had a meeting two weeks ago regarding the progress on a possible Septic Maintenance District to be established in the Hamlet of Shandaken. The District will be under consideration by the Town Board, which is united in stating that any final decision will be made by the property owners in the proposed district. In the presentation it was disclosed that a few parcels would have to be purchased by the District from a \$6.7 million fund established by CWC for the District. The same funds would be utilized to replace a failing Septic in the District at no charge to the landowner as long as the fund continues to exist. It was also explained that if constructed, there would be enough funds to replace each parcels septic as many as three times without adding funding. Although in talking with a few landowners last week the parcels indicated for purchase may not be available for use, so I've asked the engineers to investigate other options.

VOICE FEST: Id' like to again congratulate the organizers of the Phoenicia International Festival of the Voice. This year's event, from all involved, was an absolute success. From reports the Saturday evening performance filled the Parish Field like never before and Phoenicia, as well as a number of other businesses in

Town reported business from the event attendees. Congratulations to Maria Todaro, Louis Otey, Barbara Kolb, Pat Ruane and the countless volunteers and interns who helped organize this year's event. As always we look forward to next year's event.

PINE HILL: Pine Hill resident Barbara Hagstrom has helped to establish the Pine Hill-Highmount

Beautification Committee. She has been working for years in the gardens around Pine Hill but has now reached to other sin an effort to coordinate some of the efforts. Recently, she employed the help of Rich and Bob Savacool, also from Pine Hill, to do some much needed repairs to the main entrance sign. The Savacools donated their time and the material for the posts and roof on the sign and we owe them a Thank You.
