Response to the 911 House number project started by the Ambulance Service has been overwhelming to say the least! This is great news as any delay in receiving care when seconds count can cause untoward effect upon those with life threatening injuries or ailments. The demand is so high that we ran out of signs! We will continue the project, just as soon as we complete the outstanding requests. The lead time for signs has been extended as we had exhausted our supplies for current orders as well.

A few things of note regarding this project- the intent of the project is to supply signs for individuals that are residents, particularly the elderly and those that cannot afford them. Many requests were received by individuals that are operating rentals, individuals that own seasonal second homes, and people expecting the ambulance to supply the sign and install them as they are out of the State, or the Country even. Installation of signs will not be completed by the Ambulance Service. We will supply best practices for mounting literature with the completed sign, but it will be up to the homeowner to complete the installation and to pick up the sign at Town Hall once completed. You will receive an email when the signs are completed. Also, due to the overwhelming majority of individuals calling from out of State numbers, we will now require anyone requesting a sign to email at <u>ambulance@shandaken.us</u>. When you email us please specify your name, house number, and Street. Many of the out of town numbers get flagged as spam and will go unanswered or to voicemail.

This project would be impossible to complete without donors, and many thanks to the Boyer, Repke, Rossitz, and Muellerleile families whom have made this possible by providing funding, labor, and materials.

COVID UPDATE-. As of 7/29 there is one active case of COVID in the Town of Shandaken. Total cumulative cases in the Town since the beginning of the pandemic have reached 347, with 345 recovered. There is still one fatality accounted for in the Town. There are 149 active cases of COVID in Ulster County at this time, with cumulative cases in the County reaching 45,831. There are a total of 393 cumulative fatalities since the beginning of the Pandemic in the County, and a total of 45,289 individuals recovered.

They came in groups to watch the home movies and many tears were shed. Interestingly enough, we discovered that Ralph Dalton filmed the 1947 ceremonial unveiling of the Pine Hill Memorial, a priceless piece of our history.

Current searches include sharing Schaedle family history with Luke Schaedle, Cole family history with descendant Cindy Herms, Casimir family history with Jon Casimir, and searching for pictures and history of Sweet Sues over the years for Noel Wiggins, also history of our Town Hall .I also heard from Jay Rossitz who is donating many old newspapers his family had collected, I'm excited to see what history we will be able to share next.

We continue working with John Michelotti preparing for our upcoming event with the Metal Detection group known as the Noreasters'. I am still posting on 3 Facebook group pages and now on Instagram as well. I am also looking forward to the return of Vinnie Sorbelinni in August.
