SUPERVISOR'S NOTES - SEPTEMBER 2022

This month we have a three previously passed resolutions that need amending. Two are for flood buyouts properties and one, is for the town Hall flood-proof feasibility study. CWC asked it to be clearer.

There are some areas of Main Street Phoenicia that have crumbling sidewalks and they are in need of repair. Without a clear trail we aren't sure who owns and is responsible for their maintenance. I propose hiring a title company to investigate the property ownership of those areas in need of repair or the whole of Main for future reference, from Bridge Street to Rt. 214

Rob Cruickshank, from our conservation Advisory Council would like the towns people to have access to a free energy audit conducted by NYSERDA, to help folks' fine ways to reduce their energy use. We will put a notice and a link up on our website. Also, from our CAC they are going to apply for a grant to do food waste prevention and recovery through composting. We will likely have a drop-off at the Town Hall but the details are not yet worked-out. We are currently doing a greenhouse gas inventory and Climate smart action plan.

With all the extra work for STR permitting and licensing, we need previously anticipated help. We will give the Clerk and extra stipend of 350./ week until the end of the year and we are hiring a deputy building inspector starting Thursday to work part-time.

We are still working and negotiating for the Spectrum/ Charter contract and even with this public hearing, we will continue to move forward.

Eric will be setting up an auction with a company later this week to deal with obsolete vehicles and equipment.

Thank you very much for your patience, and as planned individuals that had requested a sign will be notified via email when they are ready. Pickup will occur at the Supervisor's Office in Town Hall - 7209 SR 28, Shandaken.

August proved to be yet another incredibly busy month for the Ambulance, and September is already shaping up to be yet another. As our children are back to attending school this month be mindful of them as they travel to and from. This particularly applies to when they may be waiting for the bus, being picked up, or being dropped off. Don't EVER think that whatever you are doing is more important than flashing lights on a school bus. Even our Fire, Police, and EMS responders MUST stop for a bus displaying warning lights. Given our windy roadways (ala Sunshine Hill, Wittenburg Rd, Creekside Dr., Old Plank, etc..) it doesn't take much to be distracted on a blind turn where a hazard may exist- so be extremely attentive no matter what.

COVID UPDATE-. As of 9/9 there is one active case of COVID in the Town of Shandaken. Total cumulative cases in the Town since the beginning of the pandemic have reached 363, with 361 recovered. There is still one fatality accounted for in the Town. There are 205 active cases of COVID in Ulster County at this time, with cumulative cases in the County reaching 47,929. There are a total of 395 cumulative fatalities since the beginning of the Pandemic in the County, and a total of 47,329 individuals recovered.

Whereas, an application has been duly made to the Town Board of the Town of Shandaken by Spectrum Northeast, LLC for the approval of a renewal agreement for Charter's cable television franchise, for fifteen (15) years commencing with the date of approval by the Public Service Commission.

Whereas, the franchise renewal agreement would bring the franchise into conformity with certain provisions of the Federal Cable Communications Policy Act of 1984, as amended and certain court rulings.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of the Town of Resolution finds that:

- 1. Spectrum Northeast, LLC has substantially complied with the material terms and conditions of its existing franchise and with applicable law; and
- Spectrum Northeast, LLC has the financial, legal and technical ability to provide these services, facilities and equipment as set forth in its proposal attached; and

3. Spectrum Northeast, LLC can reasonably meet the future cable-related community needs and interests, taking into account the cost of meeting such needs and interests.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of the **Town of Shandaken** hereby grants the cable television franchise of Spectrum Northeast, LLC and the **Town of Shandaken** for fifteen (15) years commencing with the date of approval by the Public Service Commission and expiring fifteen (15) years hence.
